

## Design 1 - Hall Arrangement to Welcome guests

\* Arrange the floral design that suits your Hall. (It can be an imaginary Hall)

Lesson NINE you worked from a design board - Mood Board

This lesson we are asking you to do another design board, this time a Colour Board.

There are certain requirements that you have to work with.

1. Space - size of Hall .
2. Scale as appropriate for the space available.
3. Position of Arrangement - size of space - light (Strong daylight, Fluorescent , Tungston etc.)
4. Background - if possible get a sample for your Colour Board or take a photo.
5. Other considerations - Décor - style of furniture etc. (Modern, Georgian, Victorian etc)
6. Month of the year and availability of plant material.
7. Availability of container as appropriate for decor
8. Budget

Once you have added these factors to the Colour Board you should be able to state the style, colour, size of the arrangement.



## Design 2 - Welcome Door Ring (Wreath) for all Seasons

The ring is a symbol of eternal life, it has no beginning and it has no end.. The circle of life. Wreaths have been used throughout history.

There are many ways to make a ring for the door..

Continue with the Welcome by making a door ring to match the arrangement for your Hall.

We are publishing this website during Lockdown 2020 so it is difficult to know what you have access to. You have probably seen the door rings put on doors in support of the NHS. Many have had to be made with whatever was at hand. With this in mind we give our ideas for making a ring.

\*Make whichever is best for you.

\* Make it for the current season.

It is lovely to have a Welcome ring to bring happiness to passers by or your visitors.

Relate it in some way, colour, theme etc. to your Hall Arrangement.

### WELCOME RING MECHANICS - DON'T FORGET TO ADD A HOOK at TOP TO HANG.

1. Roll of wire netting. 1. Cut a length of wire netting about 30cms by 90 - 100 cms or whatever diameter ring you want,. 2. Form into a loose sausage shape tube. 3. Stitch the two ends together with reel wire and make a ring. 4. Cover with foliage, paper, fabric or your choice.

2. wire frame + moss or Hay 1. Using a Florist's wire wreath ring cover with moss , or hay, by wrapping it with wrapping wire or twine. 2. Make it firm and go round again to make sure that it is even all the way round.

3. Ring + Newspaper. 1. Take plastic/rubber tube and join in a circle by inserting wood or something similar into one end of tube and connecting to other end 2. Fold newspaper corner to corner and make a strip. 3. Dip in diluted PVA. 4. Wrap around ring. 5. Cover Ring with decorative paper, fabric etc also dipped in diluted PVA. 6. Leave to dry. 7. DECORATE

4. Willow wreath - bought or made

5. Metal Coat Hanger. 1) Open it up and make into a circle. 2. Use the hanger hook and bend down to form a loop for hanging.

6. Straw ring - bought

7. Floral foam ring

8. Dri-foam ring studded with Box (Buxus) and sprayed with aerosol fine spray varnish or a few coats of hair lacquer.

9. Styrofoam or Polystyrene ring - can be used whole or sliced in half to make two rings. Be aware that they are now quite a thin ring, so treat gently.

10. Basketry cane, or coloured cane

11. Make a hay ring. Using a length of aluminium wire or garden galvanised wire make a hook each end. 2. Form into a ring and join the two hooks using pliers to tighten. 3. Gather a hand full of hay and wrap around the wire to form a firm ring. 4. Wrap with reel wire or string as you go.

Cover and decorate in a way that is right for you. Look at Pinterest for inspiration.

OPTIONS - hang on door or place on a table. Can have a bowl in the centre with floating candles, fruit, nuts, baubles etc.

#### HANGING A RING ON A DOOR.

Wooden

1. Staple ribbon to top of door
2. Fix a decorative hook to the door

Metal, Plastic, Glass

3. Double ribbon completely round the door.
4. A "Connect Hook" on back of door + double ribbon from Ring.



#### PROTECT THE DOOR

If necessary protect the door from marks from water or wet plant material and scratches by adding 3 or 4 wine bottle corks to the back of the ring. Push cocktail sticks into the cork and insert into back of ring.

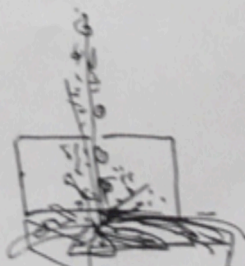

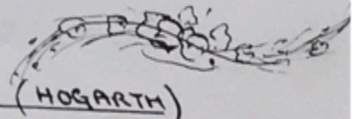

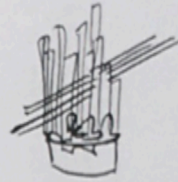
